Redding PD False Alarm Fines

Once you receive an alarm permit, you get three "freebies". This means that your system can register three false alarms before triggering a false alarm fee.

These are dispatched false alarms. If you trigger the alarm by mistake, call us right away. We can, most likely, cancel the dispatch before the Police respond. It is very important to deal with false alarms immediately. After the first three dispatches, fines start at \$65.00 and increase from there. If you are having problems and need service, call our office to schedule. You may be surprised to find (depending on your service plan) that the service call may be at no charge to you.

Annual Security System Testing Helps Stop False Alarms
